Painting Instructions for DALI PHANTOM Install products

This guide explains the procedure for painting DALI in-wall and in-ceiling speakers.

Note: Painting a loudspeaker requires great care and attention and should only be done by a professional.

A: Painting the PHANTOM IN-Wall Loudspeakers:

The original color code is NCS S0502-Y.

Note: When painting the loudspeaker, do not remove the drive units. The front grille, however, must be removed from the loudspeaker before painting.

The frame and front grille of the loudspeaker can be painted in any color to match your home decor. We recommend applying spray paint suited for metal and plastic applications.



Painting the front (flange):

It is extremely important for the performance of the loudspeaker that no paint touches the drive units. Therefore it is necessary to cover the MDF baffle and the drive units with the enclosed cover mask.

Note: The mask must be carefully positioned because the drive units are very sensitive and can be damaged by even the slightest pressure.

When the frame has been painted and the paint is dry, remove the cover mask. It can be re-used, if you wish to re-paint the loudspeaker at a later point.

Painting the front (grille):

Before painting the front grille, remove the logo badge (if mounted).

After painting, it can be replaced by the spare logo badge enclosed with the loudspeaker.

The front grille must be painted only from the front side. Right after painting, spray it clean from the rear side using compressed air to remove any paint residuals from the grille holes. Dried paint can block the sound.

B: Painting the PHANTOM KOMPAS 6M Loudspeakers:

The KOMPAS 6M is supplied with the cover mask already mounted to protect the drive units. The procedure for painting the KOMPAS 6M is the same as for the PHANTOM IN-Wall speakers.

C: DALI PHRAME - for PHANTOM EUPHONIA & PHANTOM HELICON

This frame can also be painted to match the speakers.

The frame is supplied spray-painted white. Color code is NCS S0502-Y (the same color as PHANTOM EUPHONIA and PHANTOM HELICON).
